

Berkey's Assessment of Games

1. Name of the game: Four person shuffleboard
2. Source of the game: HickokSports.com
3. Brief description of the game: In the four person version, teammates will split up and play at opposite ends of the court. The team with the red discs will go first, pushing one disc, followed by the opponent pushing the black disc. Play will continue this way until all eight discs are at the opposite end. The players at that end will align the discs with the team playing red again going first, followed by black. When all eight discs are back to the head of the court where they started, play continues with black going first.
